Transmission lines work

In our August/September Gazette we let you know that upgrading works are being carried out by Transpower in the Churton Park, Stebbings Valley and Glenside area. You may have seen helicopters working around the pylons in January. This was the start of these works which are designed to bring increased resilience to the provision of power to the grid in the North Island by replacing conductors (wires) that are reaching the end of their useful life. This section of the transmission line was built in 1992 and its route through this area was heavily influenced by CPCA input at the time.

The January helicopter work – removal of spacers between conductors and getting equipment into sites that are difficult to access by land - was part of the preparation for the main works. Further helicopter works are scheduled to take place throughout February covering line inspections and site preparation. There has also been some works undertaken on the eastern side of the motorway around the pylons in the Lincolnshire Farms region. The installation of the replacement conductors will require the operation of heavy-duty winches. There will be some noise associated with that operation but Transpower has undertaken to do the work at hours that will not unduly inconvenience those nearby. Transpower has advised the hardest part will be stringing the new conductors across the motorway.

The project is expected to last until close to Easter so your patience is requested, although any disruption is likely to be minimal.

New access tracks planned.

WCC has confirmed that an access track will be built at the south of Churton Park, connecting Prestbury Grove (off Winsley Terrace) with Ohariu Road. It will go through the new Takarau Reserve and will give a useful walking route to Johnsonville. It is scheduled to be built in the 2020/2021 year.

In conjunction with the construction of Farnsworth Drive, provision has been made for a walking track to connect to the Stebbings Dam Recreation Area. The track will provide a much shorter walking route to the CP Village for residents on the east side of Stebbings valley as well as the Reedy Block development area. A date for the construction of this track is not yet available.

Earthworks nearing completion on Reedy block subdivision.

The bulk earthworks for the subdivision on the eastern side of Churton Park are nearing completion. Residents will be pleased when the dust reduces. About 150 sections will be created, with the work having been consented in accordance with the requirements of the Special Housing Areas legislation. Main access is from Farnsworth Drive, where roading and services have commenced, with sections being on the market in 12-18 months. The development will be done in a number of stages with the road progressing towards Westchester Drive with each stage. Timing is difficult to predict but it could be 3-4 years before the road is connected. CPCA will be taking a close interest into safety at this intersection.

Highlights of 2019
